The film was launched in Europe recently and won the Best of Show award from the Cinema Verde film festival.



- 6. When we lose species we lose something in ourselves.
- 7. Animals are in our blood.
- 8. Keystone individuals are people who make a difference in their own way.
- 9. The end of shopping.

- We've reached a hell, not a paradise.
- Everyone consumes more, rather than working less.
